Dear students

Founded in **1229**, Toulouse Capitole University is one of the oldest universities in the world. With nearly 800 years of history, it draws on scientific excellence to offer degrees recognised as among the best in France and Europe.

Located in the heart of Toulouse, the university now welcomes **21,000** students across three historic sites, while extending its reach in the Occitanie region to Rodez and Montauban. It is fully committed to European integration through the ENGAGE.EU alliance, which brings together nine partner universities, and thanks to more than 200 international cooperation agreements.

The University of Toulouse Capitole brings together seven centres of excellence: Toulouse School of Economics, Sciences Po Toulouse, the Faculty of Administration and Communication, the Faculty of Computer Science, the Rodez Institute of Technology (IUT), Toulouse School of Management (TSM) and the Faculty of Law and Political Science - which, as of 1 January 2025, will become the Law School of the University of Toulouse Capitole.

This transformation marks a new stage in our commitment to academic excellence and educational innovation, consolidating our position as a national and European benchmark in legal education and research. Already ranked among the ten best law faculties in France according to Le Figaro Étudiant, our school also excels in dual degrees, whether thematic or international. It has also just been included in the Times Higher Education 2025 thematic ranking in the 'Law' category, further enhancing its prestige.

In the field of management, TSM, which is EQUIS-accredited and ranked 5th in the QS 2024 ranking in the field of social sciences and management, also confirms its academic excellence. Our School of Computer Science, meanwhile, contributed to the award of an ERC Synergy Grant in 2024, highlighting our excellence in research. And thanks to the Toulouse School of Eco-

nomics, we ranked 16th in the world in economics in 2024, according to the Shanghai ranking, remaining the top institution in France and continental Europe in this field. This major recognition now places us alongside the top 20 American and British universities.

Since 1 January 2023, our university has been an experimental public institution, a development that supports our ambitious and forward-looking strategy. With more than 100 courses (national diplomas, university degrees, preparatory courses for competitive examinations, certifications), it offers its students a real competitive advantage.

As part of its commitment to equal opportunities, the university offers courses to suit everyone: initial training, sandwich courses and distance learning, and is developing innovative teaching methods to better meet the needs of the professional world. It also supports students on scholarships or looking for employment through high-quality preparatory courses, facilitating access to civil service competitive examinations.

Committed to inclusion, it supports students with disabilities and has opened a solidarity grocery store in partnership with the Food Bank, accessible to all students in Occitanie.

With 12 research laboratories bringing together nearly 700 teacher-researchers, our university is an active intellectual hub in a variety of disciplines: law, economics, management, political science, communication, mathematics, computer science, languages, and more. Our researchers publish in prestigious journals, organise hundreds of conferences each year, and encourage the hosting of international visitors and professors.

Everyone at the university—teachers, researchers, administrative staff, associations, partners—is committed to supporting you: health, safety, well-being, skills acquisition, and successful professional integration are at the heart of our priorities

We are a university firmly committed to serving our students.







I am a student

As soon as you start the new academic year, you will have to familiarize yourself with a different organization to that of high school: lecture theatres, semesters, tutorials, etc... Understanding this organization will help you to organize yourself better and approach the new academic year with greater peace of mind.

HOW DOES THE ACADEMIC YEAR WORK?

The academic year consists of 2 semesters:

- □ the 1st semester (S1) runs from September to December
- □ the 2nd semester (S2) runs from January to April

To pass the first year of the bachelor's degree, you must therefore pass both semesters. A timetable (EDT) will be sent to you for each semester. Please note that the timetable does not include personal work, which is very important at the University!

ORGANISATION OF LESSONS: CM OR TD?

At Toulouse Capitole University, all classes last 1.5 hours.

In most cases, lectures are given in an lecture hall and are attended by all the students in the cohort (or a group of students in a large cohort, as it is often the case in first year). The tutorials are an opportunity for students to meet up in small groups and go into greater depth on the concepts covered in the lectures and to put them into practice by specific exercises (case studies, commentary on a judgment, etc.) and, above all, the opportunity to ask questions.

WHAT IS AN UE?

Each semester is made up of Teaching Units (UEs), which may take the form of lectures or tutorials (in Masters courses, UEs may also correspond to an internship or dissertation). Each time a student passes the exams for a teaching unit, he or she earns a certain number of credits (known as ECTS). To validate a semester, 30 ECTS must be obtained. A bachelor's degree therefore corresponds to 180 credits, or 6 semesters.

What about exams?

Knowledge is assessed in a number of ways: continuous assessment, i.e. throughout the semester (particularly during TDs) or during half-yearly exams, known as "partiels".

the exams take place in two stages:

- Y The 1st session corresponds to the continuous assessment and the final examination of a semester (in December or S1 and in April for S2).
- △ A 2nd session, also known as a "rattrapage" (resit session) is organized for UEs not validated at the 1st session. It is held in June for both semesters.

ECTS = European Credit Transfert System. They enable the recognition of studies and diplomas within the European area and encourage mobility.

Partiels = end-of-semester exams

Bonification = certain lessons or activities may give rise to a semester bonus.



Tools for success

A wide range of support services are available to first-year students.

Some services are available to all students, while others are specific to certain departments and may be offered following a placement test at the beginning of the year.

- The Law School Summer University: to discover the university and law studies. This preparatory
 session is free of charge and takes place every year just before the official start of the academic
 year.
- Support classes in mathematics in L1 Economics, Economics and Management, Management and AES
- An intensive English course for TSE students (optional extra)
- · The Language Resource Centre, to improve your language skills or prepare for a certification
- Documentary tutoring at the library for all students: student tutors offer individualised support with academic work and documentary research
- Support classes for students who have failed their first-semester exams





I'M TRAINING DIFFERENTLY WITH EEDU

EEDU (Executive Education & Digital University) is a service offered by Toulouse Capitole University. It is aimed at companies and all working people (public and private sector employees, self-employed people, business leaders, job seekers) as well as students who wish to pursue work-study or distance learning programmes.

WORK-STUDY

A real bridge to employment and qualifications, this training pathway is based on alternating periods of study at university and in a company. This scheme enables work-study students to obtain a state-recognised qualification and professional experience, while being paid.

There are two types of work-study contract:

- ✓ The apprenticeship contract (Target audience: young people aged 16 to 30 (special conditions apply for people with disabilities).
- The professional training contract (Target audience: young people aged 16 to 25 and job seekers aged 26 and over)

DISTANCE LEARNING

The EEDU service at Toulouse Capitole University allows you to take a university course (from the first year of a Bachelor's degree, Master's degree or University Diploma) entirely at a distance. Distance learning students have the same status and rights as on-campus students: student card, access to university libraries, online documentation, etc.

The SSE is a medical and social service reserved for students, open Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. You can make an appointment (by phone or in person) and receive confidential services at no cost:

- Medical care: nursing services (consultations, advice, guidance, treatment), general or specialised medical consultations (sexual health centre, tobacco counsellor, sexologist), preventive consultations (examinations, vaccinations), nutritionist consultations.
- Medical and psychological support: psychiatrist and psychologists
- Social support from social workers: listening and tailored assistance for academic, family, personal, administrative and financial problems.

DISABILITY

Do I need special arrangements for my studies?

- ☑ First, I meet with an SSE doctor with my medical file, who will review my request and make recommendations for accommodations if necessary.
- ☐ The recommendations are then sent to the UT disability office for implementation.

Do I need help with disability-related procedures?

→ A social worker from the SSE can assist me, answer my questions, help me put together an MDPH file and follow up on my request.

HEALTH PROMOTION

The SSE also organises numerous prevention and health promotion activities focusing on alcohol and addiction, mental health/stress, emotional and sexual life, nutrition, vaccination and sport.

On a social level, the SSE also organises various group activities related to everyday student life (budget, culture, leisure, etc.) and information sessions on entitlements (social security, supplementary health insurance, etc.).


