Artificial Intelligence in Higher Education Administration

About

Toulouse Capitole University will host an ENGAGE.EU Staff Training Week on Artificial Intelligence in higher education administration from April 20 to 24, 2026.

This staff training week aims at providing a forum for staff members from ENGAGE.EU universities to learn about the evolving role of AI in higher education administration, exchange best practices to relevantly and responsibly integrate AI in everyday office work, and reflect on desirable pathways for the implementation of AI technologies at ENGAGE.EU universities.

By allowing exchange of knowledge and good practices between administrative staff members of ENGAGE.EU higher education institutions, this staff training week contributes to strengthening and sustaining the Alliance's efforts towards bringing together communities at all levels of our institutions with the aim of driving innovation and sustainable transformation.

This one-week programme is open to administrative staff members from ENGAGE.EU partner universities. Prior to the on-site part of the staff training week, an online kick-off session will be organised to introduce the programme and the teachers. The language of instruction is English. The staff training week will host a maximum of 30 participants.

Call for Speakers

Toulouse Capitole University is recruiting administrative and academic speakers from ENGAGE.EU partner universities who would be interested in contributing to the staff training week. Each administrative speaker position involves at least 3 hours of workshop animation. Each academic speaker position involves 8 hours of lectures spread on at least 2 days. Candidates should be able to demonstrate significant experience and expertise of AI and of digitalisation in higher education.

Proposed courses should contribute to providing participants with a comprehensive understanding of how AI is (re)shaping everyday work in higher education administration, equipping them with knowledge and tools to responsibly leverage Artificial Intelligence to address challenges faced in their daily administrative work.

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to, the following list:

- Evolving role of AI in higher education administration

- Existing AI tools and how they can be relevantly used in everyday administrative work
- Responsible and sustainable use of AI in higher education administration (mitigating ecological, social and economic risks, ensuring information security and data privacy, addressing ethical issues, etc.)
- Institutional strategies for the implementation of AI in administrative work practices
- Future perspectives, emerging trends and innovations

Other relevant topics related to AI in higher education administration are welcome.

Proposed courses should be designed in an interactive way that allows an active contribution of the participants, discussion between participants and teachers, and sharing of experiences and best practices.

Proposal Guidelines

Proposals should include the following information:

- Personal details
 - Name, higher education institution, position
 - Short CV
 - Description of your experience of AI and digitalisation in higher education
- Title of the proposed workshop or lecture
- Summary (150 words max)
- Description of the workshop or lecture (250 words max)
- Tentative outline (including information about how you plan to encourage active participation and interactions)

Submission Information

Proposals should be submitted to internationalisation@ut-capitole.fr by January 18, 2026.

Selections will be made based on the following criteria: 1) Quality of the teaching plan; 3) Expertise of the speaker in the staff training week theme; 4) Balance of chosen teaching topic with other proposals.
