## **Three course proposals:**

### **French Language and Culture Course (LCF)**

Level groups from A0 to C1 (subject to a minimum number of participants)  
24 hours per semester: 2 classes of 1.5 hours per week for 8 weeks  
Mandatory attendance. 3 credits will be awarded under conditions\*

### **Specialized French as a Foreign Language Workshops**

3 workshops offered (subject to a minimum number of participant and priority given to exchange students):  
Legal French, Business French, Debating in French as a Foreign Language  
13.5 hours semester 1: 1 class of 1.5 hours per week for 9 weeks  
Semester 2 : intensive course in January 2026  
Minimum B1 level required  
Enrollment in one workshop per semester (only one enrollment per year for Business French)  
Mandatory attendance. 2 credits will be awarded under conditions\*.  
Places are limited

### **Conversation Workshops at the Language Resource Center / Centre de Ressources en Langues (CRL)**

2 workshops of 1.5 hours offered each week for 9 weeks.  
No attendance requirement, no credits awarded

## French Language and Culture Course (LCF): Levels A0 to C1

<b>Objectives</b>	Acquisition of greater linguistic autonomy in everyday life and academic settings. Gain in-depth knowledge of French society and culture.
<b>Content</b>	Pedagogical activities focused primarily on oral skills: comprehension of authentic audio and video materials and oral production activities such as role plays, presentations and debates. Written comprehension and expression, reinforced with homework assignments
<b>Assessment</b>	Continuous assessment with mandatory attendance and regular work required. * Successful completion of this course entitles students to 3 ECTS credits, subject to conditions.

## Specialized French as a Foreign Language Workshops: levels B1 to C1

<b>Assessment</b>	Continuous assessment with mandatory attendance and regular work required. * Successful completion of the workshop entitles students to 2 ECTS credits, subject to conditions.
	<b>LEGAL FRENCH WORKSHOP</b>
<b>Objectives</b>	Improve students' command of the specific features of legal French by working on expanding their legal vocabulary.
<b>Content</b>	Analysis of legal texts and materials related to current events, exercises on legal vocabulary and syntax, presentations and discussions

	<b>BUSINESS FRENCH (ECONOMICS AND MANAGEMENT) WORKSHOP</b>
<b>Objectives</b>	Acquire basic vocabulary in economics and develop the ability to communicate in French in an academic and professional context.
<b>Content</b>	Useful vocabulary and structures for commenting on numerical data and graphs, presenting an organization, describing the workings of a company and its environment.

	<b>DEBATING IN FRENCH as a Foreign Language</b>
<b>Objectives</b>	Students will choose social issues that are important to them, and debate them together.
<b>Content</b>	Producing arguments in lively oral interactions, documentary research, group work.

## CRL Conversation Workshops: levels A1 to C1

	EXCHANGING ON VARIOUS TOPICS
<b>Objectives</b>	Students will exchange freely on their cultures and experiences of living and studying in Toulouse.
<b>Content</b>	Discussions and role plays based on various materials (videos, film posters, news media and photos.)
