OVERVIEW

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ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The LL.M. includes 310 hours of teaching and seminars divided into 2 core modules and 4 specialized modules. All modules are mandatory to obtain the LL.M. degree. Courses are offered in sessions of three to five days, approximately once a month. Participants also have either to complete an internship or to conduct a group-work project under academic or professional supervision. Standalone modules and courses are available on demand and subject to special arrangements.

This LL.M. does not confer the diploma of Master but is designed for applicants already holding a Master degree or equivalent diploma, or a professional experience.
