ACCESS TO THE FIRST YEAR OF THE MASTER

Admission to the first year of the Master's programme depends on the number of seats available and is subject to a competitive examination or an examination of the candidate's file. Admission is decided by the President of the university on the proposal of a pedagogical committee whose members are appointed by the President of the university.

Selection criteria:

The admission committee will assess your application based on academic results, English proficiency, personal experiences (international and/or professional) and motivation.

Applicants will have to demonstrate their English proficiency (level C1 expected).

They must have sufficient skills in English to attend class in Toulouse and Dundee. Any academic or internationally admitted language certificate is welcome (DULS, BULATS, TOEFL, TOEIC...). However, to be admitted into Dundee in semester 4, students are required to present one of the language certificates accepted by Dundee

Targeted public:

A three-year degree in law is required, equivalent to 180 ECTS (European credits) i.e. Bachelor's degree, Licence or equivalent.

Other qualifications and area of study may be considered by the Admission Committee.

Students must have an adequate command of the English language to enroll. An applicant's English proficiency level may be demonstrated by means of score reports of recognized exams, tests or certificates or by any relevant means (study and life experience in a program taught in English...).

ACCESS TO THE SECOND YEAR OF THE MASTER

Access to the second year of the Master:
