OBJECTIVES

The Master 2 * International Economic Law (MINTEC) is a French national program taught in English. It is aimed at providing a deep knowledge of international economic legal issues. The program focuses mainly on the study of the World Trade Organisation, the European Union in an economic perspective and the international economic development. Students will also acquire basic knowledge of international law, contracts and markets regulations. Finally, the MINTEC will highlight the importance of the French legal methodology and the French language for international students.

The MINTEC is composed of two semesters of mandatory courses. The program may be taken either in

- a Research Path; students must write a master thesis
- or a Professional Path; they must do an internship (minimum 3 months) and write a report.

Students who pass the examinations and the thesis or the internship are awarded a Master degree. This degree is equivalent to a *Legum Magister* (LL.M.).

* In the French system, the Master program is divided in two years: Master 1 (first year of Master) and Master 2 (second year of Master). It is possible to apply directly for the Master 2.

PROFESSIONAL AND ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES

Students who obtain the MINTEC may have various legal job opportunities, and especially those in relation with international economic law. The program gives them the necessary skills to work in law firms, companies but also in public services, and international or European institutions.

Students who choose to do the Research Path can apply for a PhD.

- a Master 1 degree or any four-year degree (or equivalent to 240 ECTS) in Law
- knowledge in international and European legal issues is an asset
- other specialisations (management, economics...) may be considered according to the profile of the candidate
- a first professional experience in the field of economics, law or management would be highly appreciated.
- students may evidence by any means a good level of English.
