

GDPR notification – Master Degree survey

In view of the favourable opinion handed down by the French the National Council for Statistical Information (CNIS), **this survey is recognised as serving the general interest and being of high statistical quality. It is therefore mandatory**, in accordance with the French Act No. 51-711 of 7 June 1951 concerning the legal obligation, coordination and confidentiality in the field of statistics. The survey has obtained the official approval (reference **No.2022A082RE**) of the French Ministry of the Economy, Finance and Recovery, and is valid for the **2022 - 2023** school year - Decree published on 13 December 2020

The answers to this questionnaire are protected by the rules of statistical confidentiality and are intended for use by Toulouse Capitole University and the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research. For the purposes of the survey, the answers to this questionnaire, as well as the data obtained by matching, will be kept for a period of 5 years from the end of the collection process. After this period of time, the data will be archived. Access to and use of these data will be strictly controlled and limited to statistical, scientific or historical research, at all times.

This survey is governed by the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 (GDPR), and the French data Protection Act No 78-17 of 6 January 1978.

Toulouse Capitole University (Toulouse Capitole University, 2 rue du doyen Gabriel Marty, 31042 Toulouse cedex, France) and the Archives de France (in accordance with the provisions of article L. 212-4 of the French Heritage Code) are the sole recipients of the data. The data will be kept by the producing department for 5 years.
