Founded in 1229, Toulouse Capitole University is one of the oldest universities in the world. Backed by almost 800 years, its scientific excellence means that its degrees are recognised as among the best in France and Europe.

Toulouse Capitole University, with its **21.000 students**, has a campus in the heart of Toulouse, spread over three sites steeped in history, and extends into the Occitanie region in the university towns of Rodez and Montauban.

As a very active member of the European university alliance Engage.eu, alongside 8 other European universities, and with more than 200 cooperation agreements with universities around the world, Toulouse Capitole University has seven outstanding members: Toulouse School of Economics, Sciences Po Toulouse, the Faculty of Law and political sciences, Toulouse School of Management, the Faculty of administration and communication, the Faculty of Computer Science and the IUT de Rodez.

If you're in any doubt about your course path, there are workshops. If you want to go on an internship, you need to write a CV and a covering letter. There are conferences with professionals to give you ideas about careers. There's also a huge alumni network to help you build your network of contacts. You'll find all this on the University's website, but in the meantime, I'm counting on you. Come and see us, we're at your service.

the 1st semester (S1) runs from September to December and the 2nd semester (S2) runs from January to April. To pass the first year of the bachelor's degree, you must therefore

approach the new academic year with greater peace of mind.

HOW DOES THE ACADEMIC YEAR WORK?

As soon as you start the new academic year, you will have to familiarise yourself with

a different organisation to that of high school: lecture theatres, semesters, tutorials,

etc... Understanding this organisation will help you to organise yourself better and

pass both semesters.

A timetable (EDT) will be sent to you for each semester. Please note that the timetable does not include personal work, which is very important at the University!

The academic year consists of 2 semesters:

ORGANISATION OF LESSONS: CM OR TD?

At Toulouse Capitole University, all classes last 1.5 hours.

In most cases, lectures are given in an lecture hall and are attended by all the students in the cohort (or a group of students in a large cohort, as it is often the case in first year). The tutorials are an opportunity for students to meet up in small groups and go into greater depth on the concepts covered in the lectures and put them into practice by specific exercises (case studies, commentary on a judgment, etc.) and, above all, the opportunity to ask questions.

WHAT IS AN UE?

Each semester is made up of Teaching Units (UEs), which may take the form of lectures or tutorials (in Masters courses, UEs may also correspond to an internship or dissertation). Each time a student passes the exams for a teaching unit, he or she earns a certain number of credits (known as ECTS). To validate a semester, 30 ECTS must be obtained. A bachelor's degree therefore corresponds to 180 credits, or 6 semesters.

Student glossary

CM = Cours Magistral

TD = Travaux Dirigés

TP = Travaux Pratiques

UE = Unité d'Enseignement

EDT = Emploi Du Temps

MCC = Modalités de Contrôle des Connaissances. They define the conditions for obtaining a diploma.

ECTS = European Credit Transfer System. They enable the recognition of studies and diplomas within the European area and encourage mobility.

Partiels: end-of-semester exams.

Bonification (=bonus): certain lessons or activities may give rise to a semester bonus.

Knowledge is assessed in a number of ways: continuous assessment, i.e. throughout the semester(particularly during TDs) or during half-yearly exams, known as "partiels".

The exams take place in two stages:

- The 1st session corresponds to the continuous assessment and the final examination of a semester (in December for S1 and in April for S2).
- A 2nd session, also known as a "rattrapage" (resit session) is organised for UE's not validated at the 1st session. It is held in June for both semesters.





Tools for success

A wide range of support services are available to first-year students. Some of these are common to all students, while others are specific to each Faculty and may be offered following a placement test at the beginning of the year.

Here are a few examples, so don't hesitate to ask your schooling office or teachers for more information.

- In L1 Economics: refresher course in maths at the beginning of the course.
- In L1 Eco-Management: maths support to help students with difficulties succeed. This involves 12 hours of additional teaching in the form of tutorials
- In L1 Management : support teaching in mathematics
- In L1 AES: refresher course in mathematics for final year students who have not taken this course and optional support courses.
- In L1 Law:
 - Summer University
 - Facilities devoted to the methodology of university work

What happens if I fail my 1st semester exams?

The Faculty of Law offers students who failed the opportunity to take part in university support courses (TSU) at the beginning of the 2nd semester, focusing on the methodology specific to law studies.

Documentary tutoring: student tutors offer you one-to-one support with your university work and documentary research. See page 21.

The Faculty of Law's Summer University: a chance to find out more about the university and studying law. This free preparatory session takes place every year just before the start of the academic year.

I ATTEND CONFERENCES, WORKSHOPS AND OPEN DAYS

SUIO-IP organises a number of events throughout the year, which you can find in the Guidance and Integration Diary on p.30.

The Infosup fair and the Open Day organised by the University are an opportunity to meet the teaching staff and talk to the students to find out more about the courses available if you want to change your career path, and to find out about further studies, particularly at Master's level.

The workshops and conferences organised by the SUIO-IP will help you to work on and build your study project from the first year of your degree.

I WILL BE SUPPORTED BY....

• Guidance officers, your 1st contact at the SUIO-IP

They will welcome you every day, guide you and provide you with personalised advice on your academic career (courses on offer, enrolment periods, change of study path, international mobility, etc.) and your career path (civil service entrance examinations, job opportunities by sector, job or work placement searches, CVs, letters, etc.).

They run workshops on building a study project and helping students find their place in society, and organise SUIO-IP events.

Psychologists specialised in guidance counselling (National education psychologists)

They will meet you for a one-hour individual interview, by appointment made in advance at reception by a guidance officer. They offer you personalised support in building your personal and professional project and can help you with any guidance-related problems (difficulties in making choices, changing course of study, etc.).

The psychologists also run group activities: guidance workshops and information meetings (on changing career path, for example).

What if I want to change my study path?

The first year at university is an important stage in your studies. It's normal to have questions, and the SUIO-IP team can help you. If you're wondering about a change of course in first year ("réorientation"), there are a number of options available to you at the start of the school year, at the end of the first semester or at the end of the year.

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Let's do an internship

Students, don't wait until the end of your studies to do an internship! Whether it's an end-of-studies placement or a discovery placement, it's important to identify your expectations and your personal and professional goals: in other words, to think about your career plan.

THE INTERNSHIP SEARCH

I prepare my application by taking part in SUIO-IP workshops and conferences.

I am connected to the University's Alumni network alumni.ut-capitole.fr to consult:

- The internship catalogue
- Internship and job offers and I create an alert

I use the SUIO-IP's **documentary resources** (e.g. the "Finding an internship" brochure).

KEY POINTS TO KNOW

Internship agreement required:

Form to be completed from the alumni.ut-capitole.fr website and with ENT identifiers

("Internships" tab > "Apply for an agreement" section).

Internship period:

Optional work placement : from September 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025.

Compulsory work placement : from September 1, 2024 to October 31, 2025.

Duration of placements:

6 months or a maximum of 924 hours in the same host organisation.

Gratification of work placements:

Compulsory in France if the duration of the work placement exceeds 308 hours (2 months) on the basis of $\pounds 4.35$ /hour.

Important: before any placement begins, the agreement must be approved by the academic tutor as well as the University and signed by the host organisation and the student. This document sets out the teaching arrangements and ensures the student's social protection against accidents at work and occupational illnesses.

This multimedia space, co-managed by the DLC and the SCD (Documentation Department), is dedicated to languages.

In this learning area, you can:

- take part in conversation workshops in 10 languages: German, English, Arabic, Chinese, Spanish, French as a Foreign Language, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Russian (small groups of 10 students maximum);
- meet with an educational adviser (one-to-one appointments) to take stock, follow a personalised path, etc...;
- get information on site or borrow resources: learning manuals, books, magazines, DVDs, etc...;
- prepare for certifications with online resources: TOEIC, TCF, DELE;




From the day after you register, you can connect to your intranet, which will give you access to a range of resources and information related to your studies (schooling, enrolments, career guidance workshops, work placements, etc.) and your life as a student (sport, culture, health and well-being, etc...)

- your UT Capitole electronic mailbox (the schooling office usually opts for this means of communication with students), your timetable, your exam results and your student file,
- your personal diary,

- the "My online lessons" (MOODLE) teaching platform. Here, teachers offer supplementary lessons (detailed outlines, videos, slideshows, bibliographies, etc.) and online activities (quizzes, homework).

WHAT IS IT?

The university provides you with a computer account. To access it, you need a login and a password...







UNDER WHAT CONDITIONS?

This account is strictly personal and its use is subject to the rules and recommendations of the school's IT Charter.

> You are a student: your personal email address and mobile number are those you provided when you registered. To change this information, go to the "My Web File" application.

FOR WHAT?

The login page is the only way to access your personal information online (internal news, practical information, etc...), as well as all the tools, services and digital resources made available to you by the University (email, online course platform, etc.). All these tools and content are presented via the university's intranet site. In addition, your login details enable you to connect to the university's computers and to WiFi on campus.

MY COMPUTER ACCOUNT

Your computer account consists of a login and a password.

> You are a student: all students registered at the university for the current year automatically receive a computer account (the day after registration) valid for ALL the school's digital services (Intranet, Wifi, computers, etc.). First of all, you should check the status of your administrative registration with your registrar.

For security reasons, your login will not be sent to you when you register. To receive your







MISSION LOCALE : REMOJEUNE AND 16-29 PROJECT



The Toulouse Federal University and the Toulouse Capitole University are associated with the projects of the Haute Garonne and Toulouse Mission Locale. The Mission Locale is a place where young people aged 16 to 25 can find help.
